## • Profit and loss:

o Revenue: donations are rising following the recent mailing for fee support, and exceed budget for the Beyond Initiative.

- LG fees: regions: we are still waiting for fees from Germany and the
   Netherlands; fees from DUP UK have been received after considerable effort.
- o Expenses: most non-staff expenses are moderately below budget.
- o Postage: \$182 (of the \$236.52) of that is the cost of the PO Box. This cost has increased significantly in recent years.
- o Grants Misc expenses: \$392 (of the \$542.18) is the early withdrawal penalties on the 2 CDs that we cashed in early; also some accounting costs.
- o Copyright expenses are still within budget: little further work is anticipated.
- Having allocated costs for the Beyond Initiative and the Small Grants Program to the funds budgeted for them, we have net income of \$2,404.24, compared to a year-end loss of \$4,000.
- Further expenditure on Beyond (up to \$15,000) and on the Small Grants program (within the \$20,000 budget) are expected by year-end.
- o Arjun expects to lead fund-raising for Beyond in the new year.
- o In a separate part of the meeting the Board approved a 3% salary increase for the Executive Director and Office manager from 2023.

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### 4. Executive Director's report, November 2022

- <u>interactive website more suited to cellphone/mobile access</u>
  - Survey feedback showed that our website and resources have been developed for a world in which primary access is via a laptop, whereas access via mobile devices may offer new opportunities, and be more in tune with members in the future eg one could receive news alerts and news of updates on resources.
  - In discussion it was identified how the resources can already be accessed on a mobile phone, that there is an opportunity to refresh aspects of the website and was agreed to explore an instagram account for DUP IN.
- <u>In The Garden online leaders forum:</u> this has not been used for over a year, and does not function as an effective forum for discussion. **It was agreed unanimously** to close the forum and let current subscribers know. The IN facebook group continues to attract ever larger numbers of subscribers, and other media may provide alternative opportunities for networking and discussion.
- LG fee collection and reminders going well: thank you, Martha!
- <u>copyright infringement</u>: we are still waiting for trademark registration to be completed. This still has some months to run.
- since the last Board meeting <u>newsletters</u> were sent in five languages (English, Portuguese, German, Spanish and French).

#### 5. Small Grants Program

The Grants Manager requested Board approval for the release of \$20,000 for Cycle 3 of its operation that will run from January 1 through December 1, 2023: Unless we experience a dramatic increase in the number of grant applications we receive in 2023 (perhaps a possibility given the end of most Covid-related travel restrictions), we anticipate that \$20,000 will cover all Cycle 3 grant awards.

Since it began in June 2021, the Small Grants Program has received over sixty grant applications from twenty different countries. To date, we have provided funds - usually in \$500 awards - to support more than four dozen in-person and online Dances of Universal Peace events and activities. Our review committee remains enthusiastic and dedicated. There have been no unforeseen costs and, except for minor challenges (i.e. a few international wire transfer complications), the program is running smoothly and efficiently. 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Small Grants Program: update – November 2022

Since my last report to the Board in September, the Small Grants Program has approved six more grants for DUP events in Chile, India, Mexico, Turkey, Venezuela and the United States. This successful Cycle 2 will come to a close on December 1, 2022. We anticipate that the SGP will finish the cycle slightly under our \$20,000 budget, with approximately \$2,000-3,000 remaining. Exact figures will be available in December once the grant cycle has closed and a final expense report has been prepared.

Grant recipients have been diligent about submitting final reports including beautiful photos and videos of their projects, camps and retreats. We regularly receive heartfelt messages of gratitude for DUPIN's generosity.

As always, thank you for your continued support and encouragement.

Approximately 25 people are now leading dances in the middle east, some on their first stages, a couple of them already certified after 4 years since we started the beyond initiative trainings.

Thanks to the generosity of Pir Shabda and Murshid Allaudin, who were the senior teacher on board, I was able to address our caravan people to offer a closing reflection on the theme of our 2022 program (Rashid Jabbar). #### 7. Guidance Council

## 7.1 update on guidelines

Guidance Council have agreed the following guidelines, which have been added to the <u>Leader</u> Guidelines, and will be included in a forthcoming newsletter:

## **Guiding Circles and Events**

Part of being a dance leader is about leading and safeguarding the participants in their dance circles and dance events. Guiding a circle may sometimes be difficult. A purpose of the Dances, according to Murshid SAM, is to increase joy. Any behaviors, comments or attitudes in a circle or event that diminish safety and joy to the circle and the individuals in the circle are antithetical.

Dance leaders are responsible for the circle. That doesn't mean walking a patrol; yet it does mean being attuned both to the individual participants and the circle as a whole. In order for us to expand our consciousness and free ourselves from the restrictions of personality and social conditioning, we want to be safe and free! If anyone's behavior encroaches on that feeling of freedom and safety, that needs to be dealt with.

Each individual, leader, circle and situation is unique. The leader simply has to be willing to be attentive, willing to inquire if there are warning signals, and willing to take necessary action if required. Action can include outlining guidelines, commentary, and sometimes intervention.

The way dance leaders maintain this safety net is up to them, and each dance leader (or dance team) will handle delicate or difficult situations in their own way, but here are some suggestions:

- 1. Dance leaders might want to let participants know that they are expected to be sensitive to each other's boundaries, while at the same time responsible for setting and maintaining their own boundaries.
- 2. Sometimes dance leaders may feel the need to let participants know exactly what behavior is expected and accepted in the categories of sexual misconduct, drug and alcohol use, provocation, verbal aggression, and power dynamics.
- 3. During DUP events, leaders might want to designate and make known to the participants a person or team that is available to those who need physical, emotional, or spiritual support. Sometimes the amount of energy generated in a dance awakens energies that are not always easy to integrate. As well there are times when someone feels challenged by something that has happened in the event. Those who feel challenged should know that there is someone they can talk to.

## 7.2 importance of the Walks in our repertoire

A forthcoming newsletter will illustrate the life-changing power of the Walks as part of the transmission of the Dances. Walks are illustrated on the DUP IN website in <u>Articles and Papers</u>, and (under 'Walk') in the <u>Resource Library</u>.

**7.3 Cultural Appropriation** has recently been discussed by the Guidance Council. The valuable article on this in a recent newsletter will be added to the Articles and Papers page.
